

Brent Disabled Children and Young Peoples Services 0-25 eligibility threshold

To access this service a child or young person must:

- live in Brent
- be aged between 0 to 25
- have a physical or mental impairment which is permanent and substantial, and which has a negative impact on their ability to do normal daily activities.

A child with a 'severe' disability requires significant support from another person or equipment to carry out things like personal or night-time care, eating or taking part in activities.

This could include:

- a sensory impairment
- learning disability
- autism spectrum disorder
- challenging behaviour, as a result of their learning disability
- complex health needs
- palliative, life-limiting or life-threatening conditions.
