Lime in Brent

- Lime is a world-leading micromobility operator and has operated a shared e-bike service in London since 2018.
- Over 100,000 users in Brent, delivering nearly 2 million trips, since launch in 2019.
- Across London last year:
 - 16 million commuter journeys an 85% increase in rides in the city.
 - 800,000 new cyclists on the roads with 20% of our users have never cycled before in London and 60% going on to cycle more as a result.
 - 49% of those 18-34 use a shared e-bike once a week




Operational improvements

- **Fleet:** Temporary reduction of the fleet to 500 vehicles
- Parking bays: Lime is funding the creation of 200 new parking bays that are being implemented across Brent.
- Zoning: Introduced zoning to prevent parking in locations of high-complaints such as Willesden Green station.
- **Events plan:** Collaborated with Brent Council on a dedicated events plan for Wembley Stadium.
- On-street resource: Increased the number of Lime cyclist patrollers and parking wardens on-theground in Brent by 78%, ensuring that any issues reported can be dealt with quickly.
- Customer service: A dedicated Brent email where issues are addressed within 2 hours of reporting




How we are improving parking


- We are moving to a system where riders must only park in 200 designated parking bays.
 - Bays will be installed in phases and the south of the borough has already been installed
 - Installation and consultation is continuing with the ambition of turning on for the whole borough by the end of the year.
- Parking enforcement:
 - GPS technology
 - End trip photo & AI review
 - Warnings, fines and bans
- Rider Education
 - In-app notifications
 - Email communications





Lime's London Action Plan

In January 2025, Lime invested £20m into our service in London - our largest single city investment. This included:

- 1. **Parking infrastructure** We committed £5 million to our parking infrastructure fund to deliver at least 2,500 dedicated parking spaces.
- 2. **Operations** We **invested £13.4 million to strengthen our day-to-day operations,** increasing our on-street workforce by 60%.
- 3. **Technology** We introduced an advanced AI end-trip photo review to detect poor parking in real time, preventing obstruction on streets and pavements before the ride is fully ended.
- 4. **Safety** We delivered a **£250,000 safe riding campaign**, aimed at deterring illegal or unsafe behaviours and promoting responsible e-bike use.
- 5. **Community** We have invested an **additional £250,000** in our Share the Joy Fund to help more Londoners take up cycling, building on an initial £100,000 contribution in 2024.








Update on Safety

- This summer, Lime launched our 'Respect the Red' campaign focused on improving rider safety.
- As part of this, we partnered with Cycling UK to deliver cycle training masterclasses and sent rider communications on this.
- We produced advertising on billboards in hotspots in central London.
- We partnered with police on educational events.
- We worked with celebrity Josh Berry to produce social media content showcasing the importance of respecting the rules of the road.



Update on Community Engagement

• **Lime Access:** 50% discount for key workers, low income and students.

Share the Joy community fund

- Partnership with London Cycling
 Campaign
- £250,000 further investment
- £160,000 already donated to groups in Brent such as Harlesden Mums Who Cycle.
- Fifth round of funding currently open.

• Cycle training

- Cycle Sisters training
- Open to new ideas on how to broaden accessibility





Managing Micromobility in Brent







Where we are

- E-bikes now an established part of the borough transport network and popular with users.
- However rapid growth gave rise to complaints. Clear need for operations to be better managed.
- New operating plan agreed with Lime in Nov 2024. Included requirements around fleet size/management and funding for dedicated parking bays.
- Longer term plans by government to introduce regulatory framework for micromobility. TfL looking to introduce London-wide contract for e-bikes/e-scooters.








Parking Bay Implementation Programme

- Plan to implement 200 parking bays across the borough. 150 bays delivered to date – additional 50 to be consulted on during Nov 2025.
- Parking bays implemented in areas with high demand for bikes and places with a high level of complaints about poor parking.
- 'Flexible' parking on footways allowed whilst bays are being implemented. Users will eventually be required to start/end journeys within a dedicated parking bay.

Next Steps

- Consultation on next parking bay locations to start shortly - includes sites informed by operator/complaints data and feedback from previous consultations.
- Details of proposals will be sent to affected residents/businesses and public will be invited to comment via '<u>Have Your Say</u>'.
- Aim to deliver additional bays by end 2025. Bays will be subject to monitoring and review, to address any emerging issues.
- Anticipated that more parking bays will be required as service grows over time. Welcome suggestions on where these should be located.
